

The Battle of Britain was an Air Force fight between the Luftwaffe and the Royal Air Force ("Imperial War Museum"). The RAF is the Royal Air Force of Great Britain, and the Luftwaffe is the Air Force for the Nazi's ("Imperial War Museum"). This was a turning point in history, specifically World War II, because the RAF had defeated the Nazis ("Imperial War Museum"). The battle had started on July 10 1940 and had lasted until October 31 1940 ("Battle Of Britain Timeline"). This fighting had been going on non-stop for 4 months ("Imperial War Museum"). The RAF had only 750 planes in the beginning of this fight, while the Luftwaffe had 1059 planes ("Imperial War Museum"). The Nazis had wanted to take over Great Britain to show that no one could stop them, but the RAF had beaten them and had shown that they could be drafted ("Imperial War Museum").

I wanted to learn this topic because I found it interesting that the RAF had beaten the Nazis. I also wanted to learn about how the RAF pilots had been through life or death moments. I wanted to learn about how the RAF had overcome them being outnumbered. The RAF had not been alone in this fight. Also the RAF had been outnumbered for at least 2-3 months of this battle ("8 Things You"). Britain had sent out letters to all of the countries of the United Kingdom ("8 Things You"). A lot of these countries had played a big role in the Battle of Britain ("8 Things You"). There were pilots from other countries that were either taken over by the Nazis or were part of the United Kingdom ("8 Things You"). There were different pilots from different countries like, 126 New Zealanders, 98 Canadians, 33 Australians, and 25 South Africans that had fought against the Luftwaffe ("Battle Of The Nations"). They were also joined by 3 Rhodesians, a Jamaican, a Bahamian, and a Newfoundlander ("Battle Of The Nations").

In the website I had used a lot of secondary sources and primary. I had found a lot of newspaper articles that I had used. They had said that there were 175 Nazis planes shot down in the Battle of Britain. There were also reports that the Bunkunhm place was bombed for the 3rd time in 3 months. There was another newspaper article that reported that London had been bombed for 3 months straight. All of these sources were very helpful.

The Battle of Britain was a significant turning point in World War II and on the Axis Power. This battle had been from July 10th to October 31st. This had been a brutal four months for the Luftwaffe because the RAF pilots had been better trained for this kind of fighting. The Luftwaffe had also lost 34-50 planes a day while the RAF had lost 12-20 planes a day.
